LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Friday, May 31st was the "House of Origin" deadline which means that all bills introduced in their respective house have to be passed to the other house in order for the bill to remain active and continue to move through the legislative process. Both houses of the Legislature took action on hundreds of bills last week. Below is a list of bills that met this deadline and continue to move through the Legislature. Now that this deadline has passed, both houses will resume policy committees and begin taking up bills from the other house.

We continue to closely monitor amended bills daily to ensure that we are tracking all relevant bills and that our positions reflect the most current version of amended bills. BUDGET UPDATE

The Budget Conference Committee, comprised of members from the Assembly and Senate, will be meeting over the next few weeks to reconcile budget proposals on outstanding items. It is important to highlight that the \$72.1 million (for a total of \$106.9 million) for SB 678 is not in conference as it was previously approved by both houses and will be included in the final budget put forward by the Legislature for a vote. Please find attached additional background for the SB 678 May Revision proposal. Please note that this is the proposal put forward by Governor Brown in his budget May Revision. While the Budget subcommittees of both the Assembly and Senate have approved this funding to move forward, the allocation still has to be passed by a vote of the full Legislature and signed by the Governor before it is approved. We will continue to keep you updated on key budget actions.
