Re: Legislative Update: Final Month of 2013-14 Session

Legislative Update

On Monday, August 4, the California Legislature will reconvene after a month-long summer recess. Because they approved a budget within the constitutional timelines, lawmakers were able to leave the Capitol and spend July in their districts. When legislators return, they will begin a 28-day sprint toward the August 31 finish line, the constitutional deadline to conclude the legislative business of the 2013-14 session. Because August 31 is a non-negotiable deadline for all regular session measures, this is the time of year where we keep an especially watchful eye for “gut and amends.” Bills tend to magically appear starting at or around this point in the year, and we are mindful of the threats that these items represent.

Warner & Pank staff continues to monitor daily every amendment recognizing that the final days of the legislative session are prime for legislative gamesmanship. Our charge is to keep you as informed of the Sacramento landscape as possible while protecting your interests. Below is an updated list of bills that continue to move through the Legislature and will be taken up in committee and on the floor upon the Legislature’s return from summer recess. Byrne/JAG Funding

The Byrne/JAG funding allocation process is ongoing at the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC). Last week, the Byrne/JAG Executive Steering Committee (ESC) met to continue this process whereby the BSCC’s new funding strategy will be implemented. The RFP for the next round of funding will likely be approved at the September BSCC board meeting.

Proposition 47

Proposition 47, the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act of 2014, is a voter initiative for the November 2014 California ballot. This measure is sponsored by former San Diego Police Chief Bill Lansdowne and San Francisco DA George Gascon. This measure reduces penalties for certain offenders convicted of non-serious and nonviolent property and drug crimes and allows certain offenders who have been previously convicted of such crimes to apply for reduced sentences. In addition, the measure requires any state savings that result from the measure be spent to support truancy prevention, mental health and substance abuse treatment, and victim services.
