Re: Legislative Update

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Today, both houses of the Legislature reconvened for the final months of session following their summer recess. They will be hearing and taking up bills leading up the policy and fiscal deadlines for committees to hear all bills and report them to the Senate and Assembly Floors. The Legislature has until September 13<sup>th</sup> to pass all bills to the Governor for the 2013 legislative session.

We continue to closely monitor all legislative action during these last few weeks to ensure that we are tracking and reviewing any amendments that may be taken. As we enter into the final days of the 2013 legislative session, we will actively review all bills for potential "gut and amendments" in which significant and substantive amendments are taken and can often change the direction or scope of a bill.

Below is a list of bills that we continue to track. We are monitoring all bills closely and have noted active positions on bills where applicable. <a href="#">CA AB 20</a> Waldron (R)	<b>Obscene Matter: Minors</b> Provides every person who is convicted of a violation of specified offenses relating to obscene matter involving minors in which violation is committed on, or via, a government-owned computer or network, or in which the production, or control of government-owned property shall be punished by a specified maximum fine, unless the court determines the defendant does not have the ability to pay. 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### Three Judge Panel Update

The Supreme Court refused (6-3) to delay a court order for California to release nearly 10,000 inmates by year's end to improve conditions in state prisons. The following statement was released on behalf of CDCR August 9, 2013: "Today's filing lays out why the U.S. Supreme Court should hear the state's case that due to dramatic improvements to medical and mental health care in our institutions and drastic reductions to our prison population, any further forced inmate reduction is unnecessary and unsafe."

Late Friday evening, August 9, California filed its jurisdictional statement with the U.S. Supreme Court as part of the process of appealing the Three-Judge Court's population reduction order.
